Children thoroughly enjoyed with their friends and teachers. They were filled with happiness. A day well spent full of learning, fun and entertainment!!!








PENMANSHIP

Beat The Stress




"Give your stress wings and let it fly away."

Vedic Maths is an Amazingly Compact and Powerful System of Calculation.




Evacuation Drill Activity

A great personality may die for an idea, but that idea after his death, incarnates itself in a thousand lives."






LAUGH HEARTILY
